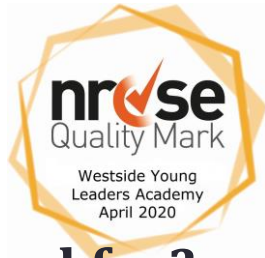
What do we stand for?

Mainstream schools cannot achieve this alone, now more than ever! We are here to support you.



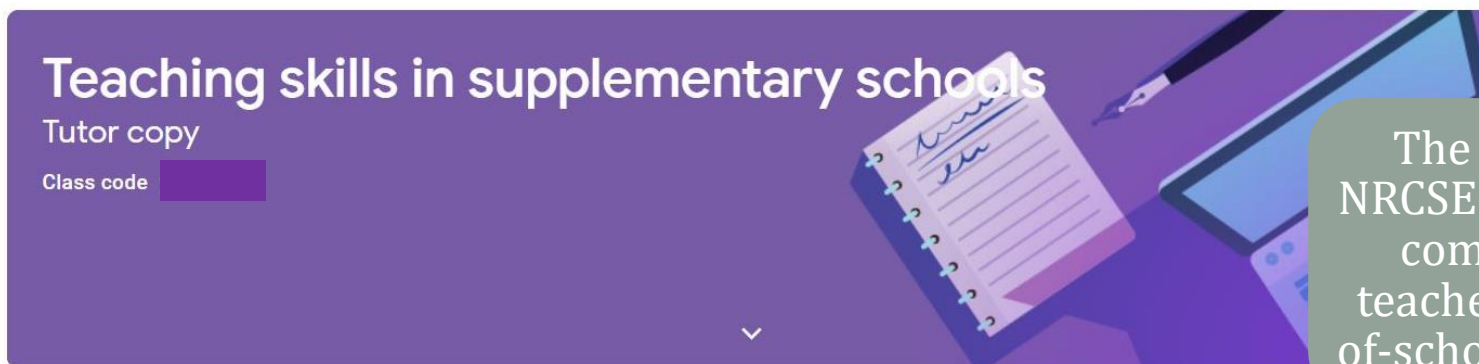
Supporting you to teach remotely

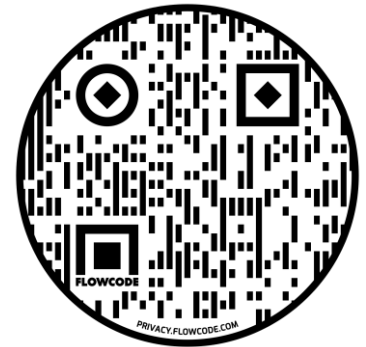

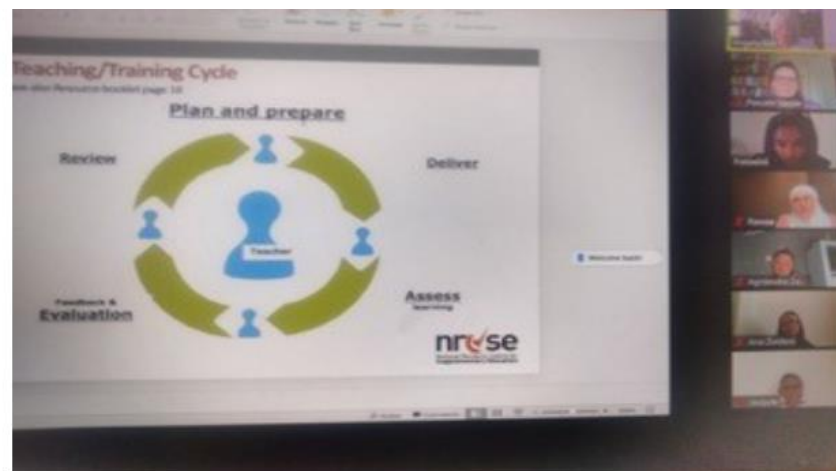

- **Socrative** to create self-marking vocabulary tests
- **Quizizz** for a range of interactive activities including audio questions for remote listening through gamification
- **Google Forms** to make self-marking quizzes
